	<p>Geography is a subject which should inspire a curiosity and fascination about the world and its people. Study should equip pupils with knowledge about diverse places, people, and resources and about the physical and human processes. Pupils should extend their knowledge and understanding beyond the local area, to Europe and the rest of the world. They should understand how the physical and the human world interact and change landscapes over time. Pupils will develop a rich locational knowledge and spatial and environmental understanding. Each year the curriculum starts with basic map skills and works through a range of human and physical areas of geography. Fieldwork is done in the summer term with opportunities for enrichment. Environmental geography is interleaved. We also use collapsed timetable time to cover this during examination season.</p>
